3 Easy steps

to ensure your child is on the right developmental path:

- 1-Complete the RED FLAG survey checklist. Your observations are invaluable to your physician and vital to your child's health. Some developmental stages occur with slight delay, or warning signs that need immediate attention. Share your concerns with your physician.
- 2-Request a <u>developmental screening</u> by your physician and contact The Arc Alliance Children's Services 610-764-8754, we will assist you through the process of setting up your initial evaluation.
 - If your child has a qualifying delay a County Service Coordinator will be assigned and develop an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP).
- 3-Your Service Coordinator will assign a team of Therapists through any number of Early Intervention Agencies (one being The Arc Alliance as well as several others).

Your team of Therapists could include: Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Special Instruction/Cognitive, Nutrition, or Behavioral Therapy for a number of hours per the IFSP.

If your child does not initially qualify for Early Intervention services contact The Arc Alliance Children's Services 610-764-8754 and we will assist you in what possible next steps you have available.
